





Outline

The act of writing, of framing thoughts and ideas within language, is one that is integral to the creative practice: it is one thing to have an idea, it is another thing to tell it.

Therefore, we want to organise a series of student gatherings, workshops and lectures where students from all corners of the Rietveld community can meet and investigate different approaches to the use of text in their practice.

The goal of this platform is, through a communal practice and space, to articulate the voice of the artist/designer. We aim to open up the often insular practice of working with text; to share with others and cultivate a space for collectivity and feedback; a body of many different voices germinating in discourse.

Generally, we see the platform addressing and intermingling with the topics Embodiment, Relationality and Future Pedagogy as outlined as means of/for Future Practices.

The Root

Our proposal for this platform is extrapolated from pre-existing, student-led writing classes in VAV where we discuss text-based work with care and attention.

In our experience, the gatherings have been very adaptable in the face of the current situation. The flexible nature of the classes lends itself to different media and presences.

The classes have garnered attention from students of other departments, and we plan, together with students in TXT and Fine Arts, to expand our scope. An interdisciplinary reach is at the root of the classes, which have always embraced a multiplicity of voices and practices.

The Platform

The intercurricular programmes allows us to widen our reach within the Rietveld as well as provide us with means to hire guest teachers, introducing a wide array of expertise and perspectives established in- and outside of the academy.




TRANSLATION

Potential guests: Radna Fabias (poet, translator), Çağlar Köseoğlu (poet and professor (EUC), working multilingually)








PRESENCE/RITUAL/CEREMONY

PERFORMANCE


Potential guests: Tine Melzer (writer, artist and researcher; we are in contact with her about teaching in the spring), Nicoline Timmer (artist)

+ Publication(s) of different kinds in the form of more curated outputs, but also as documentation/record - collaboration with students from graphic design, a space for experimentation.


